Federal savings reflect reductions in spending and do not account for potential increases in tax revenues resulting from lower employer-sponsored insurance costs (see discussion on page 3 of the main text). Part B premium savings amounts correspond to beneficiaries who pay the standard monthly Part B premium. Comprehensive site neutrality is defined as site-neutral payments for all services at off-campus HOPDs and select services at on-campus HOPDs (see discussion on page 2 of the main text). Maryland is excluded from the table due to its Medicare waiver exemption from the OPPS.
